For those new to the school, or even if you've with us for a few years now, I'd like to touch on The Kohimarama Way because it is so integral to our School.

It ensures that academic excellence is balanced with a focus on character, social, and emotional development preparing students for success beyond the classroom.

Through a commitment to high achievement, innovative teaching, and a strong school community, The Kohimarama Way **equips students** with the skills, confidence, and values they need **to make a positive impact in the world**. Which reflects the essence of our purpose.



A few years ago I presented a couple of short videos to explain why Kohimarama School was transforming and to explain learner agency. Since then we have done a significant amount of work on our innovative learning pedagogy, which is the way we teach here at Kohimarama School. Today I'd like to present another short video to explain that further to you.



So, we've just seen how our approach to teaching and learning—our innovative pedagogy—ensures that every student at Kohimarama School receives high-quality teaching that prepares them for the future. But, understandably, parents often ask: 'Does this approach actually deliver results?' 'Are we maintaining high standards in maths, science, and literacy?

That's a fair question, and it's one we take seriously. To answer it, we don't just rely on our own observations—we also look to **independent**, **externally conducted studies** that benchmark our performance against other schools..

Let's take a look at what these assessments tell us about student achievement at Kohimarama School.

Why Independent Assessments Matter




- Kohimarama School regularly reviews independent assessment data to ensure our students are achieving at high levels.
- In 2024, we received the results of two key studies that provide an external, objective measure of student progress:.
 - Curriculum Insights and Progress Study a NZ-wide assessment of student achievement.
 - Trends in International Mathematics and Science Study (TIMSS) an international study benchmarking NZ schools in maths and science.
- These assessments are **conducted by independent assessors**, with students randomly selected to participate.
- Led by **trusted research institutions**, including the University of Otago, these studies provide an unbiased measure of our school's performance.
- The results allow us to compare our achievement against schools with similar characteristics and national norms, helping us track progress over time.


These assessments are important because they provide us with an **objective** way to measure student achievement—not just within our school, but in comparison to **other schools like ours** and **national norms**.

They are **conducted independently**, with **randomly selected students**, which means the data gives us a fair and representative picture of student learning. These studies are run by credible institutions, such as the University of Otago, and give us a **clear benchmark** for where we stand in key subjects like maths, science, and literacy.


Most importantly, they help us **ensure we are maintaining high academic standards** while delivering an **innovative and future-focused approach** to teaching and learning.




You can see from the diagram that Kohimarama students performed significantly above the NZ-wide average in numeracy, science and writing.



You might be asking, But ... wouldn't you just expect Kohimarama School to be above the average? Being a high decile area our students come to school ready to learn, and we have many highly educated professional people in our parent community.




TIMSS confirms that our students don't just perform above the national average – they perform above schools with similar characteristics, including some integrated and private schools. So what's behind these exceptional results?






The reality is that effective teaching and learning are not about the shape of a room or whether it has walls—it's about the pedagogy, the expertise of our teachers, and the way learning is structured.

We've just seen the independent assessment results, which show that our students are thriving academically. If hubs were truly a barrier to learning, we wouldn't be seeing these high levels of achievement.


We want to move past outdated labels and focus on what really matters—how teaching and learning happen at Kohimarama School. That's why we are shifting to calling all our classrooms 'Learning Spaces.' This reflects the reality that every space functions as a place for high-quality learning, where teachers collaborate and students benefit from shared expertise. This Hall is also a learning space as I hope that you have gained knowledge and insight into our Kohimarama School, Way of Being.

I encourage you to engage with your child's learning experience with an open mind. What's important is not the physical structure, but the high-quality teaching and strong student outcomes we see across the school.





In order to make the access to school services and information easier, we have given you access to a front page which gives you a one stop shop to all of the various online components. This includes Kindo, Newsletters, Website etc. and later access to student learning via Spotlight. Spotlight will replace SchoolTalk as the Learning Management System. When fully implemented at will provide you with access to what your child is learning, Their progress and achievement and a variety of reports both static and dynamic. i.e. you can see a report based on where they currently achieving against the NZ Curriculum at any time.



We are excited to partner with Mitey over the next three years to grow and support the mental health and wellbeing of all our students.



- The Sir John Kirwan Foundation has designed Mitey with NZ teachers and the University of Auckland to provide an evidence-based approach to teaching mental health education to primary and intermediate aged children.

HOW IT WORKS...

- A Mitey Coach works with staff to develop teaching and learning. This will also ensure Mitey is tailored to our school's unique culture and community.
- Mental health education will be taught by our teachers in every classroom with the skills, knowledge and understanding of mental health woven into what is already being taught. The programme compliments our Kohimarama Way and our work on the Zones of Regulation
- Parents and the whole school community are an integral part of Mitey's approach and as with all our learning your engagement and support is a key aspect of educating our students.

WHY THE NEED...

- Mental health concerns and issues amongst NZ youth have doubled in the past 10 years and we know that unhappy students don't learn.
- Youth suicide rates in NZ are among the highest in the world. Partnering with Mitey allows our school to be part of a transformational change for young people by enabling them to nurture their mental health and that of others for the rest of their lives.
