

Education Outside the Classroom

Year 7 and 8's work on a biennial programme that covers learning both in and outside of the classroom. Students experience targeted trips that support their learning within the classroom, but also support their skills outside! We run a biennial programme to ensure that each year students are experience new things - but also so that we can give each challenge the importance and attention it deserves.

WILLIAM PIKE CHALLENGE

The William Pike Challenge is all about getting young people to step outside of their comfort zones and develop 21st Century skills.

The challenge focuses on completing 5 Outdoor Adventures, 20 hours of Learning new skills and finding a new passion, and completing 20 hours of community service. This Challenge runs throughout the year and is a big focus for that time

Personalised Learning

Learning in the Year 7 and 8 Learning Space is designed to prepare learners for their high school or college years. It requires students to develop independence, resilience, self motivation and to apply their assessment capability.

WORKSHOP LEARNING

Like many areas of the school we use workshops to teach new content and skills to students. A workshop in Year 7 and 8 is an opt in session with the teacher to learn or to consolidate skills.

For the majority of our learners they are able to accurately and independently choose the best workshop for them. They learn to be assessment capable and reflective about their strengths and weaknesses or at least spaces for improvements!

This choice and 'booking in' style of learning is a stepping stone for choosing subjects and physically moving around spaces when they get to high school.

The way Mathematics workshops ran was great as we were able to choose what we wanted to learn. There was always a range of levels so we could push ourselves and maximise our learning time.

DICE MODEL

Students and teachers use the DICE Model of learning (linked to the Kohimarama Way, Dream, Inspire, Create and Empower) to explore interests, skills, strengths and new ideas

Students will apply this to most areas of the curriculum, but most notably when taking part in:

- STEAM Fair Projects (alternative years)
- Speech writing and planning
- Thursday Unplugged options
